Tasks to do with Students:

#### **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. How have the media and government portrayed asylum seekers, and how does this video challenge those portrayals?
- 2. In what ways does the Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project make a positive impact on the lives of asylum seekers?

**Research Assignment:** Investigate the current policies in Australia regarding asylum seekers. How have these policies evolved over time, and what are their implications? **Role-Playing Exercise:** Assume the roles of different stakeholders, such as government officials, community members, and asylum seekers. Conduct a simulated discussion on immigration policies and the role of organizations like BASP.

**Letter Writing Campaign:** Write letters to local representatives expressing your thoughts on asylum seeker policies and advocating for more compassionate and just treatment.

**Community Engagement Project:** Plan and execute a project to raise awareness about asylum seekers' challenges and support organizations working in this field.

**Guest Speaker Invitation:** Invite a representative from BASP or another organization working with asylum seekers to speak to the class and answer questions.

**Comparative Analysis:** Compare Australia's approach to asylum seekers with that of another country.

Explore the similarities, differences, and potential lessons that can be learned. **Opinion Piece:** Write an opinion piece discussing your perspective on how society should approach asylum seekers, drawing on insights from the video. **Reflective Journaling:** Reflect on your own preconceptions about asylum seekers before watching the video and how your understanding has evolved. What actions could you take to contribute positively to the situation?

- 1. Set up the outline of a House
- 2. In the outline, put words that are preventing asylum seekers from having a 'Freedom and a Safe Home' around the outside or on the border.
  - Legal restrictions
  - Language barriers
  - Lack of documentation
  - Discrimination
  - Financial constraints
  - Limited housing availability
  - Bureaucratic delays
  - Social isolation
  - Employment challenges
  - Healthcare access
  - Racism
- 3. Ask members of your community to write down on a sticky note what 'Freedom and Home' means to them.

#### **Class Activity:**

#### The Asylum Game: Seats of Safety (Rules and resources in link)

This game (like musical Chairs) focuses on **Refugees and Asylum Seekers**, which can raise awareness about the challenges these individuals face and spark empathy and understanding in the same interactive way. The goal is still to help participants understand the circumstances under which people become refugees or asylum seekers, and the barriers they encounter in trying to find safety and stability.

Syrian Journey Choose your own escape route from war-torn Syria to a safer place in Europe and face many challenges and tough choices on the way.

Brothers Across Borders An interactive journey based on the true stories of Syrian refugees in Turkey. Walk in the shoes of Ismael, a 21-year old Syrian refugee on a mission to find his brother, Muhammed.

<u>Restoring Family Links</u> In this interactive presentation we take you on the journey of a young girl called Nadine. You have the chance to experience her story and decide what you would do if you found yourself in Nadine's situation.

Organisations such as BASP rely entirely on the support of the community to help their clients.

They receive no government support, and the rental bill alone is \$100,000 per month.

Pay a power bill. Each class could pay the power bill for one family for a month= \$130

**Pay for groceries.** Supermarket vouchers allow asylum seekers to buy the essentials they need.

**Collect essential foods:** Canned tomatoes, Basmati Rice, canned tuna, Olive or vegetable oil

**Other essentials:** dishwashing liquid, cleaning equipment, Shampoo and conditioner. Deodorant. (Please contact BASP for a more extensive list.)
